EMPLOYMENT

Entered the Sri Lanka Administrative Service through competitive examination, with Economics as Special Subject, in 1960.

1960-1967: District Land Officer. In this capacity I served in four of the 22 districts of Sri Lanka and was engaged in work related to agricultural and rural development of these regions. Acted as Co-ordinator of several large settlement schemes based on the provision of irrigation facilities to new settlers and was also engaged in tasks related to minor irrigation schemes. Was specially concerned with the provision of agricultural credit, water supplies, construction of infrastructure for agricultural development and development of marketing facilities and worked extensively with grass roots civil society organisations. In Walawewatte Village in Hambantota District, I initiated the formation of the Walawewatta Rural Development Society for the integrated development of this settlement of 1,000 families and I acted as President between 1962-1964. During 1960-1967, I had many administrative responsibilities, apart from land administration, such as food distribution in emergency situations, organising local government elections and assisting in the organisation of national elections in the districts I served in.

1967-1969: Assistant Secretary (Plan Implementation), Ministry of Land, Irrigation and Power. In this capacity, I was in charge of monitoring and evaluation of programmes and projects of this large development Ministry. I was also specifically concerned with the formulation of the multi-purpose Uda-Walawe Basin Development Project for financing by the Asian Development Bank. Also acted as Secretary of the Committee to inquire into the operation of the Gal Oya River Basin Project (the Amaratunga Committee). I was responsible for work involving the Department of Forests, and the State Plantations Corporation, which owned large tracts of tea and rubber.

1968-1969: Served as Secretary of the Sri Lanka Administrative Service Association (SLAS) and was closely involved in the reform of the higher echelons of the Public Service.

1969-1970: On leave doing post-graduate work at the London School of Economics.

July 1970-November 1970: Research Associate, Academy of Administrative Studies. During this period I was involved in the formulation of Syllabuses in Development Economics for Examinations to be conducted by this Institution. I was also concerned with reform of provincial administration.

December 1970: Appointed Senior Assistant Secretary of the Ministry of Planning and Economic Affairs, with particular responsibility for its overall administration.

From 1972: In addition, appointed as Director of Economic Affairs, with particular responsibility for international economic issues. I also functioned as Director of Sri Lanka/UNDP/UNDTCD Project on Development Planning - a major technical assistance project to strengthen the capacity of the Ministry of Planning and Economic Affairs (1974-1977) - and as Director of Sri Lanka/UNDP/UNCTAD Project on International Trade in Commodities (1975-1977).

Served as a Member of the Board of Directors (representing the Ministry of Planning and Economic Affairs) of the following agencies in the Public Sector:

Functioned as Director of MacKinnon MacKenzie & Co Ltd (a major shipping agency firm), which was a joint venture of the Government of Sri Lanka with the private sector (1972-1977).

Member of the Board of Directors of the USA Educational Foundation of Sri Lanka - a joint enterprise of the Sri Lanka and US Governments (1971-1977). The Board was responsible for overseeing technical cooperation arrangements between Sri Lanka and the US.

Functioned as non-resident Alternate Director for Sri Lanka of the Asian Productivity Organisation, Tokyo (1976-1977).

Worked as Consultant to the Office of the Secretary-General of UNCTAD in preparing report on the establishment of a Third World Commercial and Merchant Bank - a proposal adopted at the Fifth Non-Aligned Summit (April-May 1977, Geneva).

1970-1977:

During this period I was responsible in the Ministry of Planning and Economic Affairs for a broad spectrum of tasks. My main concerns over this entire period were the administration of the Ministry and the co-ordination of policies of the Sri Lanka Government towards United Nations and other international economic organisations (other than IMF and IBRD). This also involved a major concern with Sri Lanka's bilateral economic relations and, in particular, the international trading prospects of her three major commodities - tea, rubber and coconut.

Worked in close liaison with the Foreign Office, the Prime Minister's office, the Cabinet Office and the Ministry of Trade in the evolution of a foreign economic policy for Sri Lanka,

particularly during the period 1973-1977, in the aftermath of the oil crisis. This was a period of active involvement in the Fifth Non-Aligned Summit in Colombo in 1976.

The more important tasks undertaken during this period are briefly described below:

Supervised arrangements for expansion of the Ministry of Planning and Economic Affairs through establishment of 22 District Planning Offices in the country and recruitment and training of an expanded cadre of planning officers. This was the start of the process of strengthening provincial administration and of devolution and decentralisation.

Acted as Economic Advisor to the Prime Minister of Sri Lanka on her visits abroad - to the Fourth Non-Aligned Summit in Algiers (1973), to Iraq (1975), to Commonwealth Heads of Government Summit in Kingston, Jamaica (1975), to the five Asean countries, Burma and Japan (1976-1977).

Functioned as Secretary-General of the 29th Annual Sessions of ECAFE (1974) held in Colombo and was, thus, responsible for the entire organisation of the first major international conference held in Sri Lanka.

Was responsible for the formulation of the proposal submitted by the Prime Minister of Sri Lanka to the 29th session of ECAFE for the establishment of a World Fertiliser Fund. This proposal was followed by the Joint Sri Lanka-New Zealand Resolution at the United Nations General Assembly (1974) for the establishment of the International Fertiliser Supply Scheme. FAO later established this Scheme and the Fertiliser Pool.

Active involvement at the Preparatory Meetings of the World Food Conference and at the World Food Conference itself in 1974 as Sri Lanka delegate particularly in relation to new initiatives in international fertiliser policy. Sri Lanka made this her chief concern at the World Food Conference which, after prolonged negotiation, accepted the need for the development of a World Fertiliser policy.

Functioned as Member and Secretary of the Committee appointed by the Cabinet to inquire into the establishment of a National Prices Commission. I was also associated in preparing proposals for Profit-sharing and Workers' Participation in the public and private sectors in Sri Lanka.

Initiated the establishment of the Development Planning Unit in the Ministry of Planning and Economic Affairs with UNDP assistance and was appointed as National Director of this unit on its establishment. Developed proposals to implement the "New Dimensions" of UNDP in the implementation of this project. Along with the UNDP Project Manager, I was concerned with the direction of research within the project. A particular concern was the formulation of an Energy Policy for Sri Lanka and a Food and Nutrition Policy. I initiated the establishment of a Rural Energy Centre by UNEP in Sri Lanka - one of the three pilot energy projects of UNEP in the Third World. Also initiated work on the Integrated Regional Development Project for Kurunegala District (1977) - the first IRD project in Sri Lanka.

Worked closely with Cabinet Office in the preparation of Observations on the economic aspects of cabinet memoranda submitted by Ministers over a period of nearly four years and was responsible for the preparation of a Weekly Note to the Prime Minister on items on the Cabinet Agenda dealing with economic issues. Almost all Cabinet papers were seen by me and comments made, as appropriate, during the period 1971-1977.

December 1977-February 1978: Attached to the Ministry of Plantation Industries and assisted in the formulation of domestic and international tea policy for the new Government. Prepared the preliminary papers for the establishment of the National Institute of Plantation Management.

March 1978: Left Sri Lanka on leave from Government. Subsequently tendered my resignation.

March 1978-May 1980:

Joined the team organised by the International Foundation for Development Alternatives (IFDA) in Nyon, Switzerland (an international NGO), in association with the Third World Forum to implement "The Third System" project financed by the Governments of Canada, the Netherlands, Norway and Sweden. The project was intended to organise and co-ordinate research efforts of a large number of non-governmental organisations and individual researchers on issues relevant to the UN Special Session on Development in September 1980. My specific concern as Director of Research was on the clusters of issues relating to collective self-reliance and Money, Finance and Commodities.

During this period, I worked in a voluntary capacity as Resident Representative in Geneva of the Third World Forum. I was joint Editor of the Third World Forum Newsletter - a journal primarily dealing with third world issues. I was responsible for the journal in this new format, dealing with substantive economic issues, having obtained financial support through IFDA from its Third Systems Project, and subsequently from IDRC, of Canada.

I also edited the Occasional Papers Series of the Third World Forum.

June 1980-May 1986:

Consultant to the Commodities Division of UNCTAD. My work has been primarily concerned with (1) developing a new technique for supply management in commodities; (2) producer co-operation in tropical beverages; (3) an overall assessment of international technical assistance to the commodity sector at the country level; (4) evaluation of the UNDP technical assistance project in support of UNCTAD's concern with commodity development - the processing, marketing and distribution of commodities. These tasks resulted in several reports written by me and are listed later.

Consultant to the Office of the Secretary-General of UNCTAD and to the Information Division of UNCTAD. I was responsible in recommending and subsequently assisting in the publication of the UNCTAD Monthly Bulletin in a new and expanded form. It has now established itself as a regular journal.

During 1984, I was concerned with the organisation of UNCTAD's 20th Anniversary activities, through the organisation of national seminars and information activities, I was joint editor of the Special Issue on UNCTAD of the Bulletin (August 1984) of the Institute of Development Studies, Sussex, England. I have also lectured extensively to student and academic groups at the UN, Geneva. I also had special responsibility to develop contacts between UNCTAD and NGO's and research institutes.

Consultant to the International Fund for Agricultural Development (IFAD) in Rome on the preparation of a publication on IFAD's policies and projects and programme experience, based on in-house material. Also prepared two papers on (i) Rural Poverty Issues within the UN System, as IFAD's contribution to the 40th Anniversary of the UN and (ii) on IFAD-NGO relations.

Consultant to FAO on International Commodity Agreements. Wrote major study listed later.

Consultant to the World Food Council (WFC). Prepared background papers on food policy.

Consultant to the UN Non-Governmental Liaison Service in Geneva and in this connection, prepared papers on Least Developed Countries, External Debt, Development Aid and an overview study of UNDP technical assistance to Sri Lanka over the last two decades. Also undertook a lecture tour of the Scandinavian countries on the subject of Development Aid, following work on the subject.

Consultant to the international Council for Voluntary Agencies (ICVA) in Geneva and, in this capacity, prepared the paper on International Food Policy which was subsequently presented as the NGO paper to the 10th Anniversary Ministerial Session of the World Food Council, held in Addis Ababa in June 1984.
